Rationale

According to the World Health Organization, by 2030, one in six people in the world will be 60 years or older. During this period, the proportion of the population aged 60 and above will increase from 1 billion in 2020 to 1.4 billion. By 2050, the global population of people aged 60 and over will double (2.1 billion). The number of people aged 80 and over is expected to triple between 2020 and 2050, reaching 426 million.

Europe, with a few notable exceptions, leads the global aging process. After the demographic transition of the 19th century, we witnessed the emergence of an "elderly continent" in all countries of the European Region: a population over 65 that was previously limited to 3-5% has grown to represent, in some nations, 20% or even a quarter of citizens. The challenges posed by this macro-trend are formidable, encompassing social, economic, healthcare, welfare, and social security aspects. However, this does not justify viewing old age merely as a "cost" or financial burden, nor can old age be accepted as a time of decline characterized by the loss of relationships, functions, and prospects. We are convinced that our elderly citizens play a fundamental role in modern societies and that their protection and care are a strategic investment and an opportunity for development for all countries. This is a significant public health issue that unites us and deserves to be addressed in its multiple facets. The increase in life expectancy has resulted in the emergence of generations of healthy older adults, with energy and a desire to contribute to the growth of society, generations to whom we owe a constructive response. In this regard, active aging is an important starting point on which to focus. The rise of statism, unfortunately often internalized by the elderly themselves, calls for a firm and constructive defense of elderly rights. In this context, a Charter of Rights and Duties for the Elderly will be presented to the esteemed representatives of various academic institutions for adoption and dissemination.

The Roman Academy of Public Health, an academic institution founded in Italy, aims to create a widespread movement among universities in the Eastern European region for collaboration in the fields of research, the formulation of valid and innovative welfare policies, and the defense of elderly rights. This network will be launched at the conference, accompanied by the proposal of a multicenter study.
